Evening: David Stannard is our speaker this evening and we are grateful to him for preaching. His subject is as follows:


"In the midst of the genealogy of the descendants of Judah, written in 1 Chronicles 4, appears the name 'Jabez'.

¹⁰ Jabez called upon the God of Israel, saying, "Oh that you would bless me and enlarge my border, and that your hand might be with

me, and that you would keep me from harm so that it might not bring me pain!" And God granted what he asked.
